# PLAYGROUND PROJECT UPDATE

While the project has been years in the making, the Park & Recreation area at the Heidelberg Township municipal property is nearly complete! With the aid of a State Conservation Grant along with Land Development Park & Recreation Fees and the hard work of the Park and Recreation Board, Hanover Engineering and Heidelberg Township staff, the playground is shaping into a family-friendly fun area. To complement the playground, the basketball court has been resurfaced and painted to allow for the play of both basketball and pickleball. A portable pickleball net is located at the court area for ease of movement between sports.

The Picnic Pavilion is available for reservation free of charge to Township residents only. The pavilion is available from dawn to dusk with no alcohol allowed on the premises. If you have any questions or would like to make a reservation, please contact the township office at (717) 949-3885. Some adjustments and additions to both the playground and ball court sections are still scheduled so an Official Opening Date will be arranged for some time next year. The pictures below show the improvements already made to the township property and we hope you enjoy the new features.
